The Survival of the Fit: A Foundation for the Future

At the One Ocean Summit, I spoke about a concept that is foundational to how Maritime Blue operates: the **Survival of the Fit**. It's a profound shift in thinking—away from the “Survival of the Fittest,” which emphasizes isolation and cutthroat competition, and toward a model of collaboration, adaptation, and mutual benefit. The ocean crisis is too vast for any single entity to solve alone, which is why we must create platforms where the regulator, the innovator, and the investor are incentivized to co-create solutions.

That platform is the **Innovation Cluster Model**. This model shifts the focus from simple debate to **Joint Innovation Project implementation**. Our collaborations, such as the Sustainable Maritime Fuels Collaborative, the Tacoma Blue Edge Network (TBEN), Blue Wind, the Salish Seaweed initiative, and Quiet Sound, are examples of this model driving real public and private investment and progressive policy outcomes.

It also convenes multiple sectors to take a **Whole Systems Approach** to new markets and the challenges we face, including effective and inclusive community engagement as

well as supporting early-stage innovation from ideation to commercialization.

Our Next Chapter: The Strategic Action Plan 2025

As an organization, Maritime Blue is entering a new phase of growth focused on global leadership and transformative scale. Our [2025 Strategic Action Plan](#) is our roadmap, guiding our work across five key Strategic Goals:

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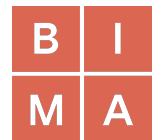
